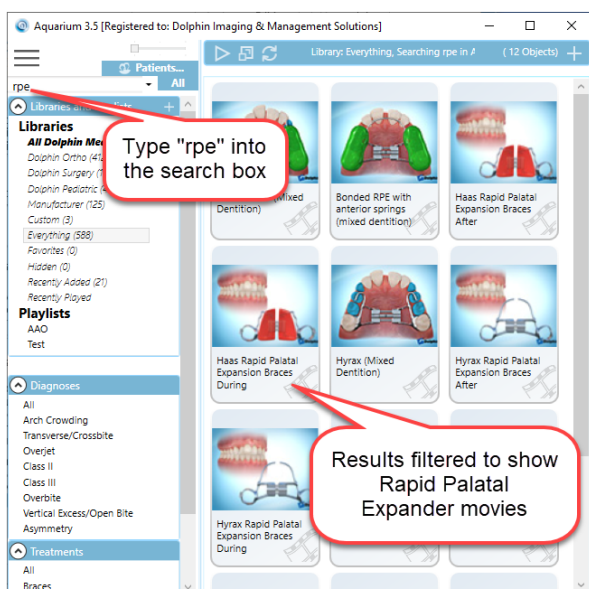
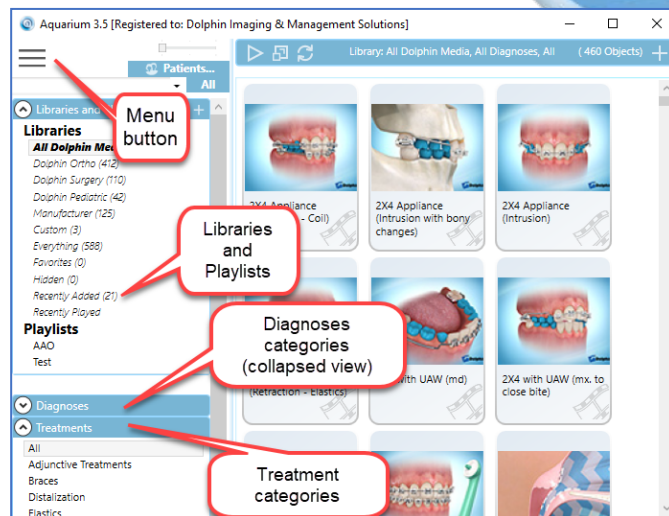



Aquarium v3.5 Quick Start Guide




Follow the Steps



- 1. Online Help:** At any time in Aquarium, you can press <F1> on your keyboard to view the online help.
- 2. The Main Screen:** At the top left corner is the menu button. Below that is the keyword search box. Below that are the libraries and any playlists you have created. Each library name is followed by its content count inside parentheses. Below that are the diagnoses and treatment lists. Media thumbnails take up the right side of the screen. The main window is sizable, and the divider lines can be dragged to divvy up the screen real-estate. The Libraries and Playlists, Diagnoses, and Treatments lists can be collapsed down. The screen can be zoomed (to make images and text bigger) with the slider on the upper left corner of the screen. You can also move the panels to the right side of the screen.
- 3. To Play a Single Movie or Slide:** Simply double-click its thumbnail. See further details below.

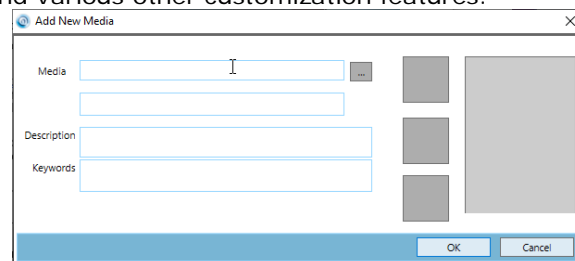


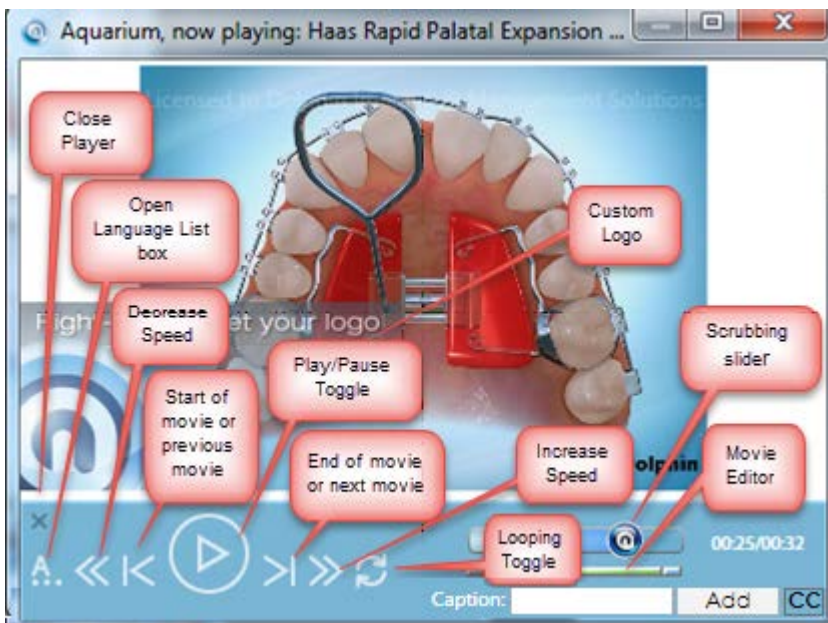
- 4. Finding Content by Diagnostic and/or Treatment Category:** Instead of scrolling thru the entire inventory of media, you can filter the list down by selecting a diagnostic and/or treatment category. If you click a Diagnosis category, you will see diagnostic movies related to that diagnosis. If you then also click a treatment category, the results list will switch to the various treatments in that category for the selected diagnosis. For example, clicking "Class II" Diagnosis will show a list of movies that explain a Class II diagnosis. If you then click the "Fixed / Removable Appliances" treatment, you will see a list of various appliances that can be used to treat Class II. Click "All" to return to the entire list.
- 5. Finding Content by Keyword:** You can also filter the list by typing a keyword into the search box. For example, type "RPE" or "Expander" to quickly locate all of the rapid palatal expander movies. The drop-down next to the keyword search displays your recently-used search strings.
- 6. Creating, Editing and Ordering Playlists:** If you frequently want to show a particular sequence of movies, you can create a playlist. Click "Add Playlist"  at the top of the Playlist area, enter a name for your playlist, and click OK. Now you can add movies from the library to your playlist either by right-clicking and selecting Add to Playlist, or by

dragging the movie thumbnail to your playlist. If you click a playlist, you will see the thumbnails for that playlist, in order. You can reorder a playlist by dragging its thumbnails. In addition to creating playlists of common movie sequences, you can also create one or more playlists that simply contain groupings of movies you use, giving you shorter lists of movies through which to search. You can right-click on one playlist or library group, such as Favorites, and make it your default that appears whenever you launch Aquarium.

- 7. Viewing Movies and Playlists:** You can view any individual movie by double-clicking on its thumbnail, or by right-clicking on its thumbnail and viewing the movie in full screen, or preview (to view a triple-speed preview, to see if it's the movie you want). Similarly, you can play or full-screen-play an entire playlist or entire library group by clicking the play or full screen buttons above the list of thumbnails.    The third button in this group toggles "looping" on and off, for repeating the movies in a continuous loop. Use the fourth button to export the playlist and share it with other users (NOTE: Custom content will not be exported; other users must add the custom content to their own system.)
- 8. Menu Button:** Many additional functions are available through the menu button, including applying various "skins" to the program, foreign language support, importing playlists from other users, and various other customization features.

- 9. Adding your Own Still Images and Movies:** Adding an image to Aquarium is as easy as "dragging and dropping" your image onto the thumbnail screen. Or, you can click "Add Media"  at the top right corner of Aquarium to add your own content. Browse  to your image or movie file and type in a description. Enter additional search keywords for finding your item, and click OK. Now you can play your item or add it to playlists, etc., just like you can with Aquarium's built-in content. Aquarium supports standard still image file formats, and it supports most movie files that you can play on Windows Media Player.







10. Adjusting Playback Speed, Pausing and Looping: Generally, when running a playlist, Aquarium plays the movies in order, from start to finish, and then stops. However, there are several buttons that can alter this. “Play/Pause” toggles between playing and pausing. Each click of “Decrease Speed” progressively slows down the playback. “Increase speed” does the opposite. The first click of “End/Next Movie” will skip ahead to the end of the current movie. The next click will skip to the next movie in the playlist. “Beginning/Prior movie” does the opposite. “Looping” Toggles between looping mode, in which the playlist repeats indefinitely, and non-looping mode, in which playback simply freezes on the last frame of the last movie. “Close Player” is simply a convenient copy of the Windows Close button at the top right.

11. Scrubbing: When you are playing a movie, you’ll see the progress bar moving along the bottom. If you pause the movie, Aquarium supports a

powerful feature called scrubbing, in which the movie updates live as you drag the slider back and forth. This makes it easy to drag back and forth or to locate an exact spot on a movie, such as to a particular age/development stage in a tooth eruption movie, or scrubbing back and forth in an appliance movie to highlight a subtle change in tooth positioning for a patient.

- 12. Custom Logo:** At the bottom left corner of the movie playing window is a placeholder logo. Right click on that to replace it with your own practice logo; to reset to the default logo; or to remove the logo entirely. If you remove the logo, and later want to add one back, while viewing the movie, right-click in the logo area, and select Show Practice Logo when Viewing Media. You can also control the logo display with the Options dialog box, accessible from the Tools | Options menu.
- 13. Multiple Audio Tracks:** You can record one or more audio tracks for any movie or still in the Aquarium program that does not contain manufacturer-provided audio. Right-click on the movie, select “Record Audio” and you can create your own custom soundtrack for the movie. Mouse over and click on the  Change Language button (shown above) to bring up a dialog box where you can add a new language or select from a list of languages before you record. Each recording you make will be associated with the language you select.
- 14. Movie Editor:** Use the Movie Editor slider (shown above) to change the start and end points of a movie.
- 15. Publishing a Playlist:** Click the export button and select “publish” to publish the movies in the current playlist, in Windows Media format, along with a Windows Media Playlist file for playing them in order, to a flash drive or writable CD, etc.
- 16. Exporting Media:** Right-click on any movie or image in Aquarium and select “Export” These movies will be stored in Working\Aquarium\Export on whatever computer stores your Aquarium movies, and from there you can place them in PowerPoint presentations, burn to CD, include on your website, etc. To access this folder, simply click on the menu button (upper left corner) and select “View| Exported Content Folder.”
- 17. Publish to YouTube:** Export any movie or image in Aquarium to YouTube. Right-click on any movie or image, and select “Export” to open the Export Settings window. From here select the Upload to YouTube button.
- 18. Hidden Movies library:** Any movie you don’t use/want/need can be moved to the Hidden library to prevent it from displaying on the thumbnails or in any search. Click on the movie, and drag it to the Hidden library. To restore a movie from hidden, right-click on the movie and select Unhide.
- 19. Shared library:** If you are also a Dolphin Imaging or Dolphin Management customer, and you open Aquarium from a patient record, the Shared library becomes available. You can add any movies or stills to this library so you can share it with that specific patient using AnywhereDolphin and/or the new patient-facing mobile app, My Orthodontist.
- 20. Foreign Language UI Support:** Switch the Aquarium user interface between various languages via the Languages sub-menu. When you select a language other than English, user interface text, libraries, treatments, diagnoses, media names, and keywords are translated into that language.
- 21. Keep Track of Played Movies:** View a log of what movies you have played or which movies you have played for a specific patient. Click the menu button, and select “View | Played Content Report” to open the Played Content Report, which shows you a detailed list of all played media. If you have Dolphin Imaging, Dolphin Premium Security Utilities, and/or Dolphin Management installed, you can also view played content for the logged-in employee or for a specific patient.

Updates: Updates are distributed via the Dolphin Updater Service – the  icon near your Windows clock. We release updates every three months. Also, you can menu select “Help | Aquarium Content List”, which is a shortcut to the content list on www.dolphinimaging.com. Here you can see a list of the existing Aquarium movies, and of our current priority order for upcoming movies (subject to revision).
